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## 1. INTRODUCTION

### **About College:**

The Pithapuram estate was ruled by illustrious sons of Rao family, beginning from Sri Rao Rayanam Garu in 1602. In the succession, later on, Neeladri Rayanam Garu was recognized by Moghul Vice Roy as Rajah of Pithapuram.

His eldest grandson Sri Rao Venkata Mahipathi Gangadhara Rama Rao became the Rajah in 1861. He was good administrator and legendary philanthropist. Today's P.R. Government College was first started by him as a High School in August 1884.

In appreciation of his services the prince of Wales conferred on him the richly deserved title "Maharajah" in 1887. Later he was nominated as a member of the then Madras Legislative Council in 1877. He was blessed with a son on 5th October 1885 who was named as Surya Rao Bahadur. The child lost his mother on the third day after his birth. Sri Gangadhara Rama Rao also died in 1890 when the child was five years old.

Smt. Rani Bhavayamma Rao of Chitrada groomed the boy. At the age of nine he was sent to Madras where he had his High School education in Newingdon School. He passed his Matriculation Examination from Madras University at the age of seventeen.

After winning a legal battle he ascended the throne and became the Maharajah of Pithapuram on 19-02-1907. He married Rani Chinnamamba Devi, Daughter of Sri Rajah Venkata Rangaiah Appa Rao of Nuzvid Estate.

Sri Mokkaapati Subbarayudu was his tutor in Madras High School, who moulded the Rajah into a fine gentleman with noble qualities.

Sri Subbarayudu was a genius and a scholar in English, Telugu & Sanskrit. He was a great visionary. He was brought as a dewan of Pithapuram Estate. He had done Yeoman service to develop the estate.

Sri Surya Rao Bahadur himself was a scholar in English, Telugu and Sanskrit languages. He was a lover and patron of men of letter and artists.

Pithapuram estate flourished well during the reign of the Maharajah.

More than any one, it was Brahmaharshi Venkata Ratnam Naidu garu, the revered guru of the Maharajah, who guided him in matters of religion, education and social reform. He also

encouraged him in works of charity and welfare of the people.

The Pithapuram Durbar was an abode for all men of letter, writers, pundits and musicians. It was really a golden age for Pithapuram. Like Sri Krishna Deva Raya, the Maharajah encouraged many poets and writers in his court. Veritably the Court was a nest of nightingales. Pundits like Sripada Lakshmi Narayana Sastry, Tata Subbaraya Sastry, the famous musician Sri T. Sangameswara Sastry adorned the court of the Maharajah. Sri Panugantivaruru and Devulapalli Brothers, and Venkata Parvatisa Kavulu were the "Court Poets". Similarly, a number of famous Telugu writers like Chilakamarthi and Veeresalingam Pantulu were welcomed and honoured.

The Maharajah's service to Telugu literature was commendable. The Telugu Academy was started under the guidance of Late Sri Jayanti Ramayya Pantulu Garu. He took keen interest in publishing old manuscripts. With enormous financial assistance he brought out an Encyclopedia in Telugu, which was named after him, the Surya Raya Nighantuvu' A number of eminent scholars like late Sri Kasibhotla Subbaraya Sastry and late Sri Divakarla Venkatavadhani were employed for the work. In recognition of his service to Telugu Literature, the Andhra University conferred on him D.Litt. and Kalaprapoorna.

It was in the Maharajah's Court that the great Veena exponent late Sri T. Sangameswara Sastry spent his whole life as estate musician. (1873-1932) There were a number of episodes about his expert rendition on the Veena. Tagore once visited Pithapuram and Rajah donated one lakh of rupees for Santhinikethan.

Kakinada, was the gift of the late Maharajah of Pithapuram, Sri Rao Venkata Mahipathi Suryarao Bahadur. Its cosmopolitan culture, its religious tolerance was due to the influence of Brahmanism - a sort of refined Hinduism - practiced and propagated by the Maharajah under the benign influence of his great guru late Sri Raghupati Venkata Ratnam Naidu.

Brahmarshi Sri R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu Garu, was a servant, a scholar of eminence and a staunch Brahmo leader. With his imposing personality and dignified figure, with his religious fervor and zeal for social reform, he exercised a wholesome influence on the intellectuals of Kakinada. He was the Principal of P.R. College for 17 years. Kakinada was a seat of Brahmanism for three decades. The Brahmasamajam Brahmo Mandir opposite to the Science College was the citadel of Brahmanism. Here marriages were solemnized under the guidance of Sir R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu, Dr. Vemuri Ramakrishna Rao and Sri Peddada Rama

Swamy, Eminent scholars used to deliver lectures in this Mandir. Till recently it housed the library of Sir R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu.

The Maharajah spent huge amounts of money on education. He raised the P.R. College to the First Grade status in 1926, when the Andhra University was started in the same year. P.R. College is the pride of Kakinada, the first of its kind in this area. Here girls were given education free. The Science College, the High School and the attached Hostels were the gift of the Maharajah. When the strength grew in numbers, the Arts college was shifted to the present building situated in the heart of the town. It has an area of 36 acres full of green lawns and mango trees.

The place now occupied by the Super Bazar, the L.I.C. building and Venkataratnapuram are the gifts of the Maharajah. The Building where Sir R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu lived and passed away was given to the Harijan Hostel in Venkata Ratnapuram.

The Maharajah's heart was tender and full of the milk of human kindness. His compassion for the poor and the depressed classes and his concern for the Harijan Girls resulted in the birth of an orphanage. The beautiful and spacious building which is now Rangaraya Medical College was the orphanage run by the Maharajah of Pithapuram. Here Harijan Girls were fed, clothed and given free education. The Maharajah took up the Harijan problem even before Gandhiji thought about it. So too in Pithapuram there used to be a similar facility for Harijan Boys and Girls.

The Shastipurti celebrations of the Maharajah were held for five continuous days at Pithapuram. It was a splendid spectacle for all, a feast to the eye and the ear. poets and musicians, pundits and philosophers, artists and actors, the poor and the needy received invaluable gifts on the occasion. He personally distributed silver bowls containing gold coins to all the scholars and pundits. It was a land mark in the life of the Maharajah.

In 1948 with the abolition of the 'Zamindari System' the Maharajah handed over the management of the College with its assets and buildings to the Government of Madras. The century old institution, trained thousands of students and provided opportunities to many students to serve and work in the institution. Many eminent administrators, scientists and artists were the products of this great institution. The College was the heart of Sri R. Venkataratnam Naidu Garu and the orphanage was the darling child of the Maharajah. The

Maharajah passed away in 1964 With him the glory of the estate also waned and an era ended. He was a fine gentleman, cultured, dignified and charitable. His charity knew no bounds. The spirit of the Maharajah Broods over the college. But his college, a temple of Learning stands there forever spreading sweetness and light, a monument to the munificence of the Maharajah. We shall remember him with profound gratitude

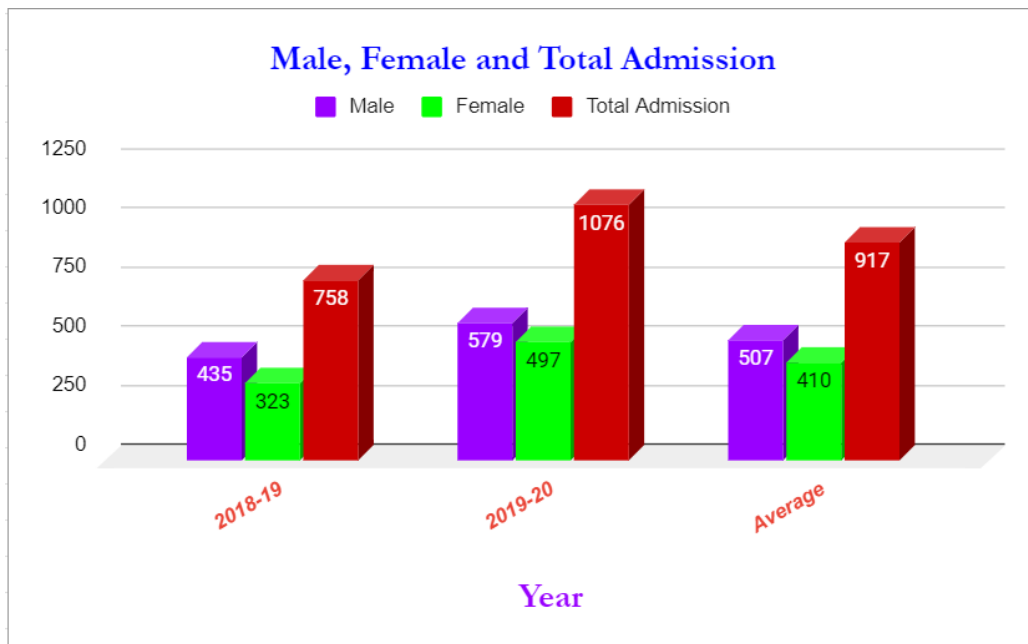

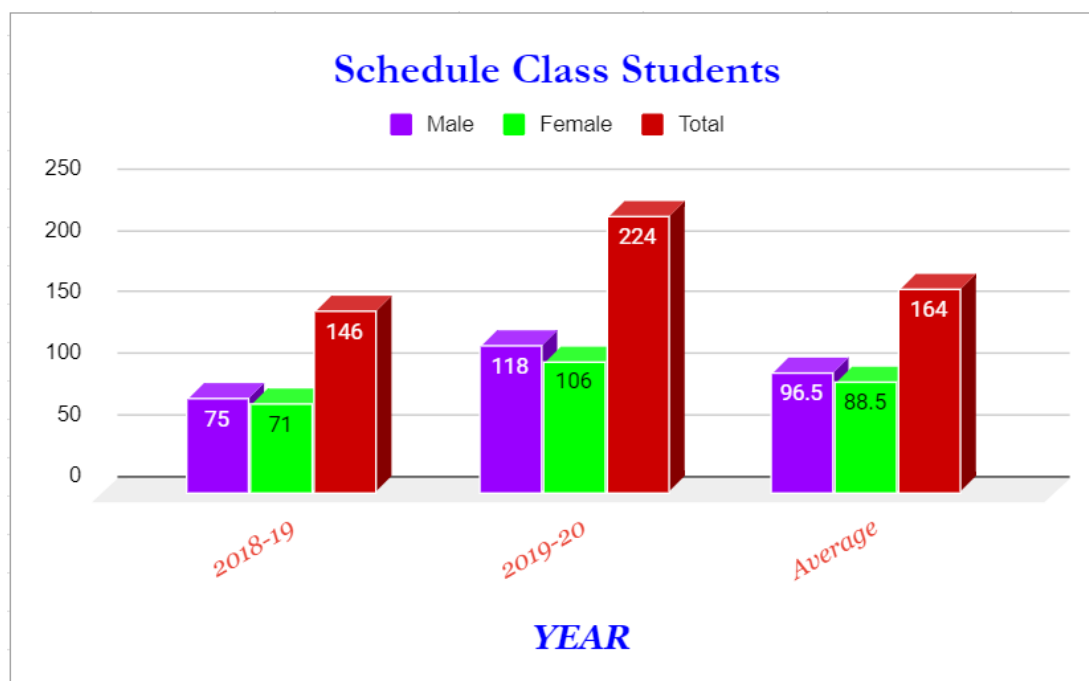
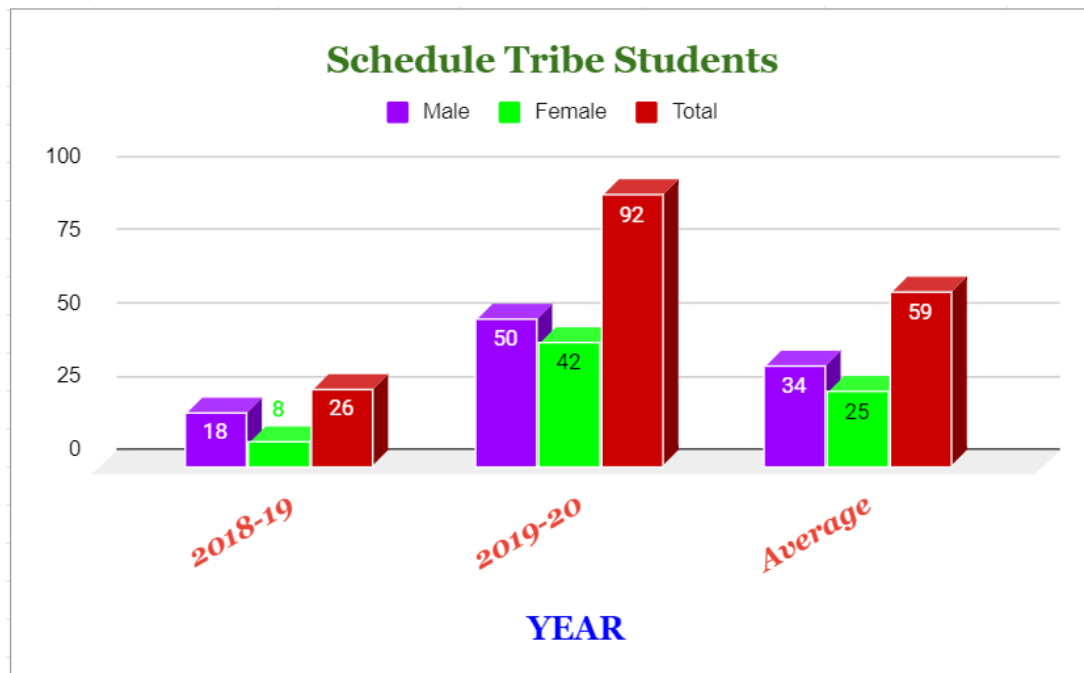

**Figure No. 3:** Graphical representation of ST category students admissions

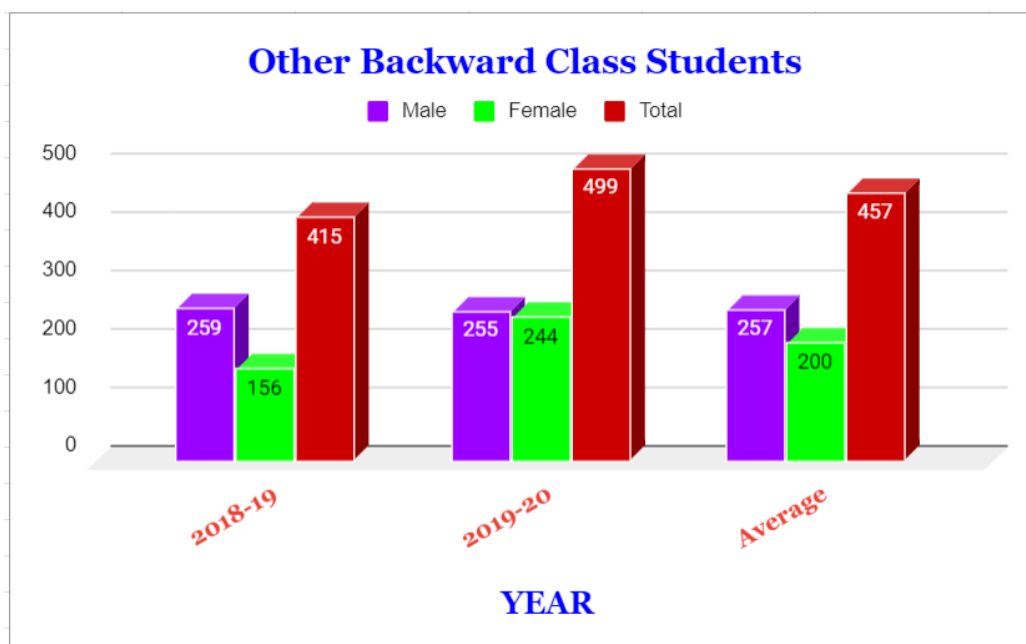

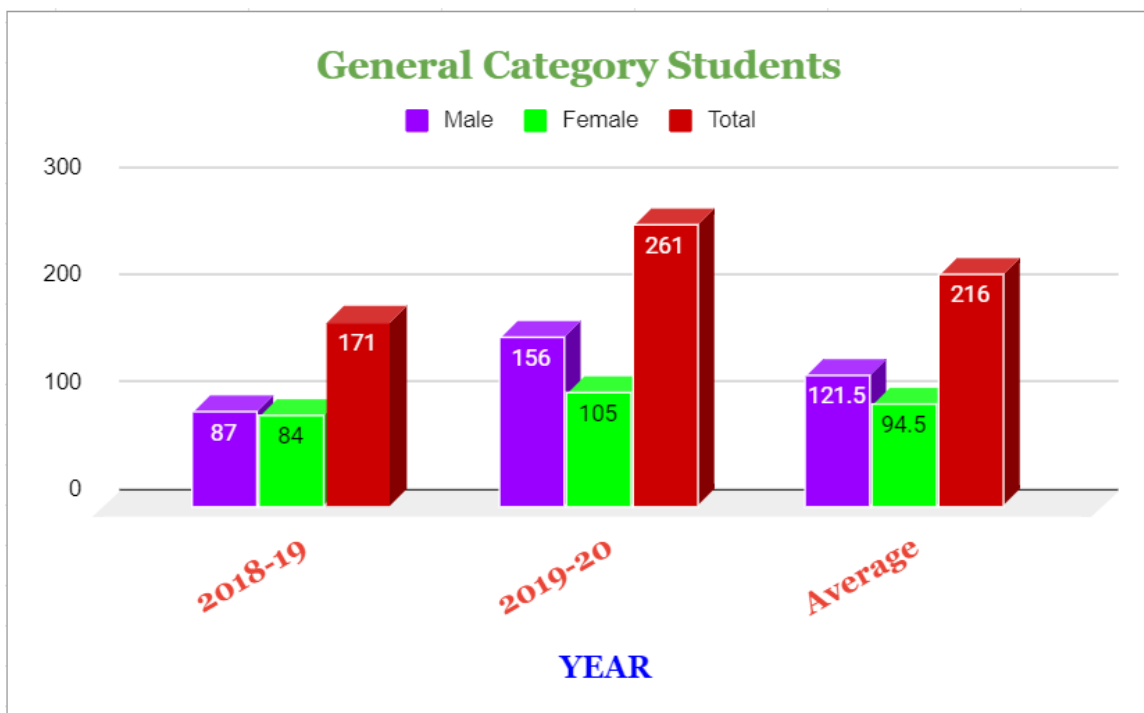
**Figure No. 4:** Graphical representation of OBC category students admissions

**Figure No. 5:** Graphical representation of General category students admissions

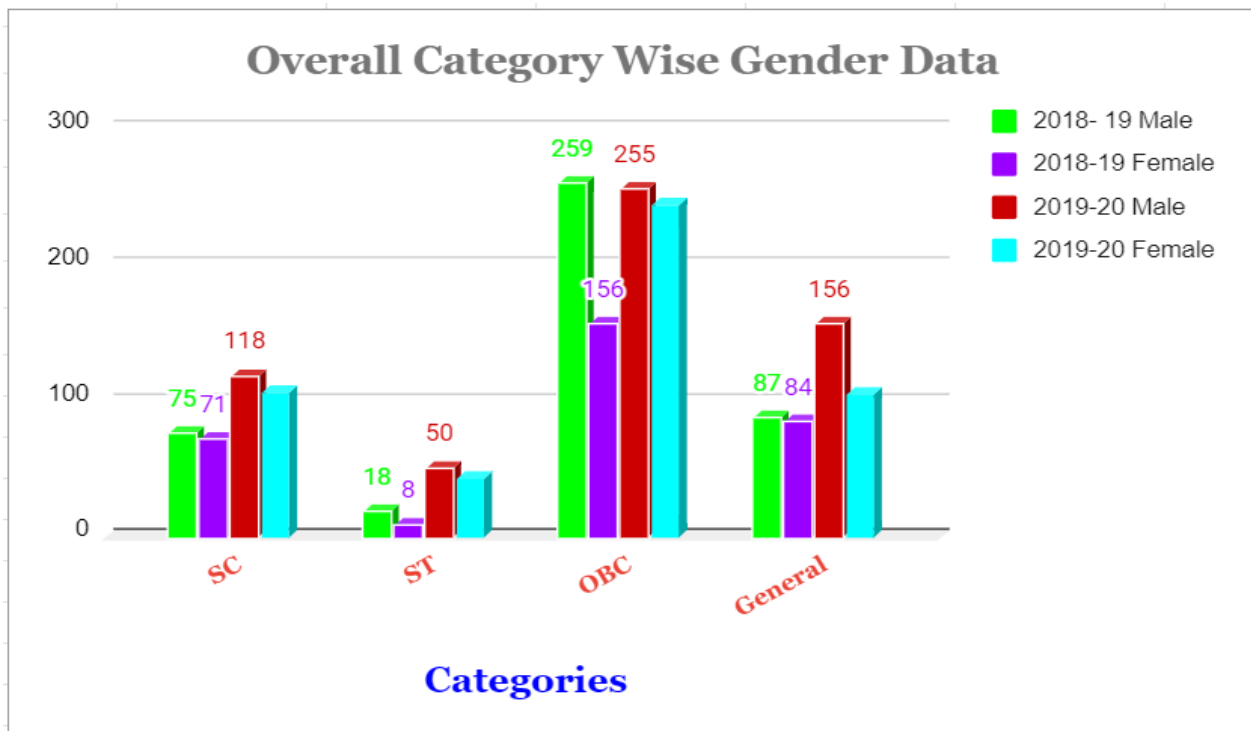

**Figure No. 6:** Graphical representation of overall category wise students admissions for two years

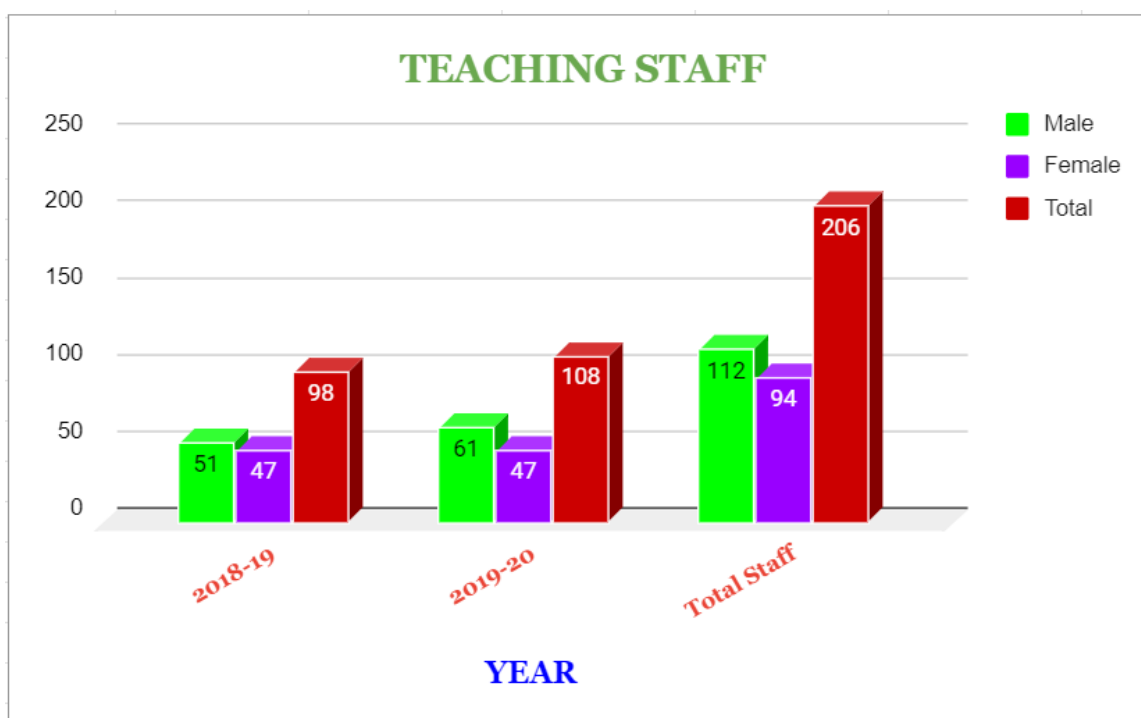

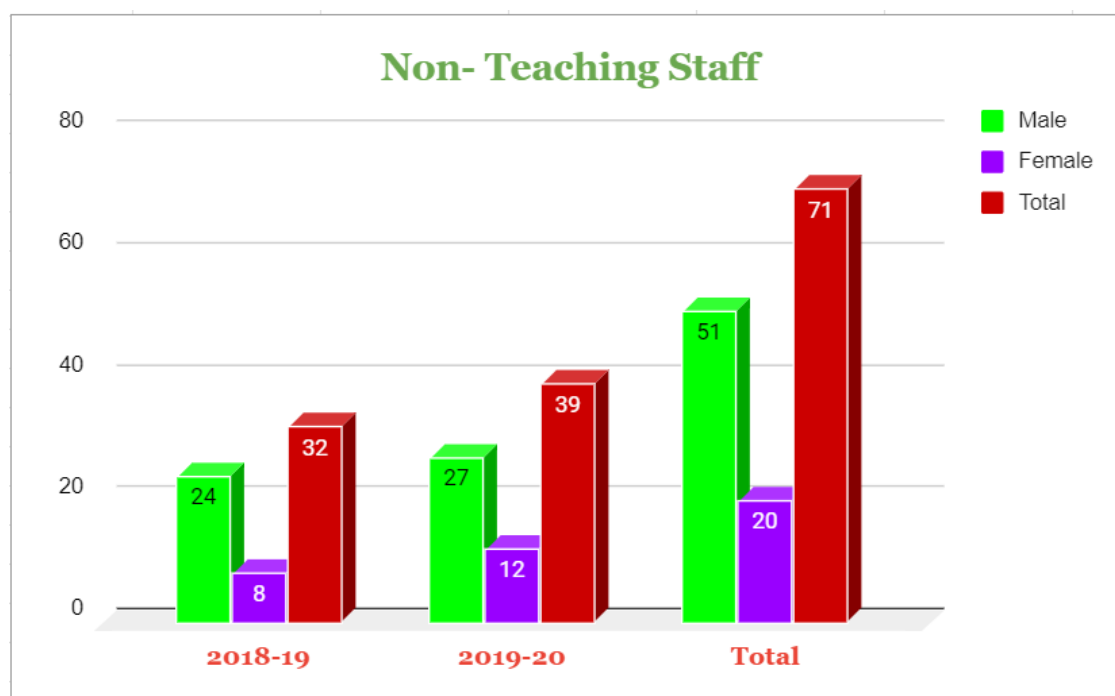
**Figure No. 7: Graphical representation of Teaching Staff Male/Female Classification during three years is given in Figure no. 8.**

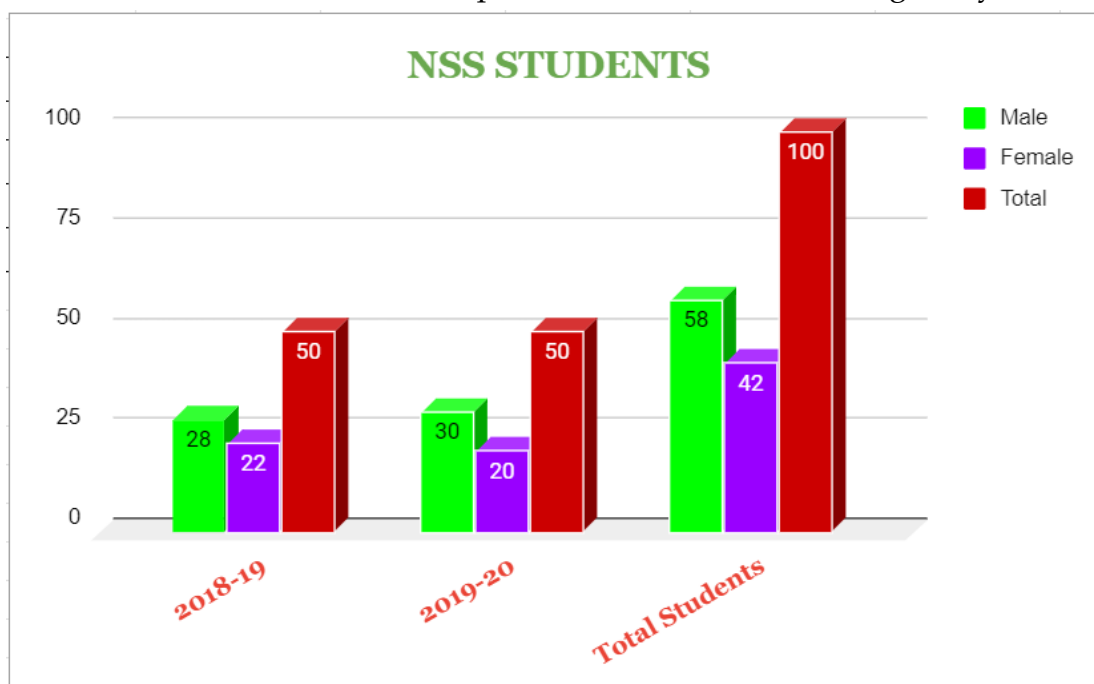

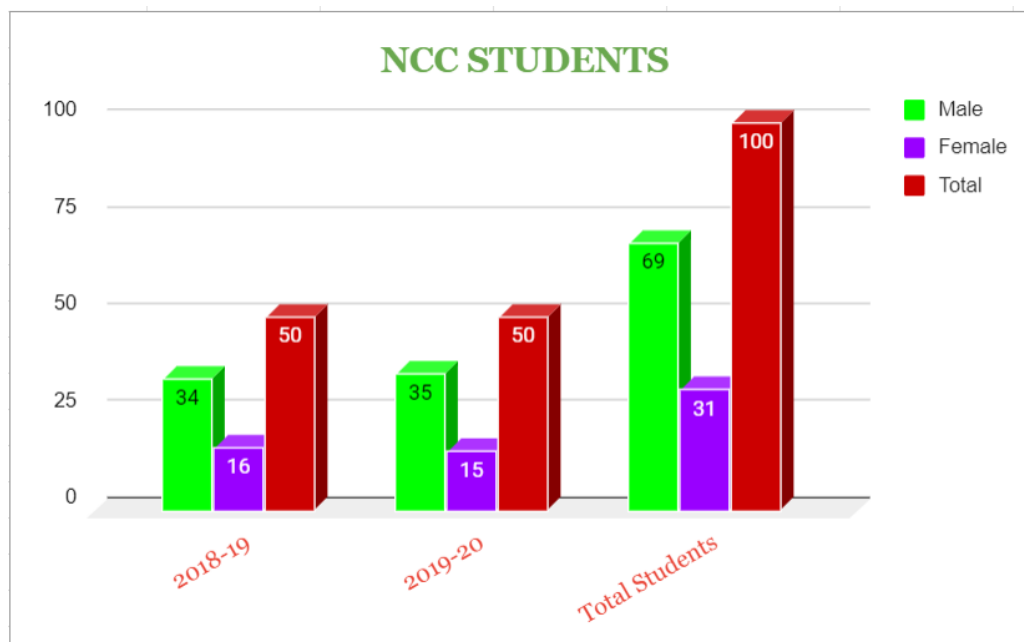


Figure No. 10. Graphical representation of No. of students enrolled in NCC during the last three years is given in Figure no. 10.

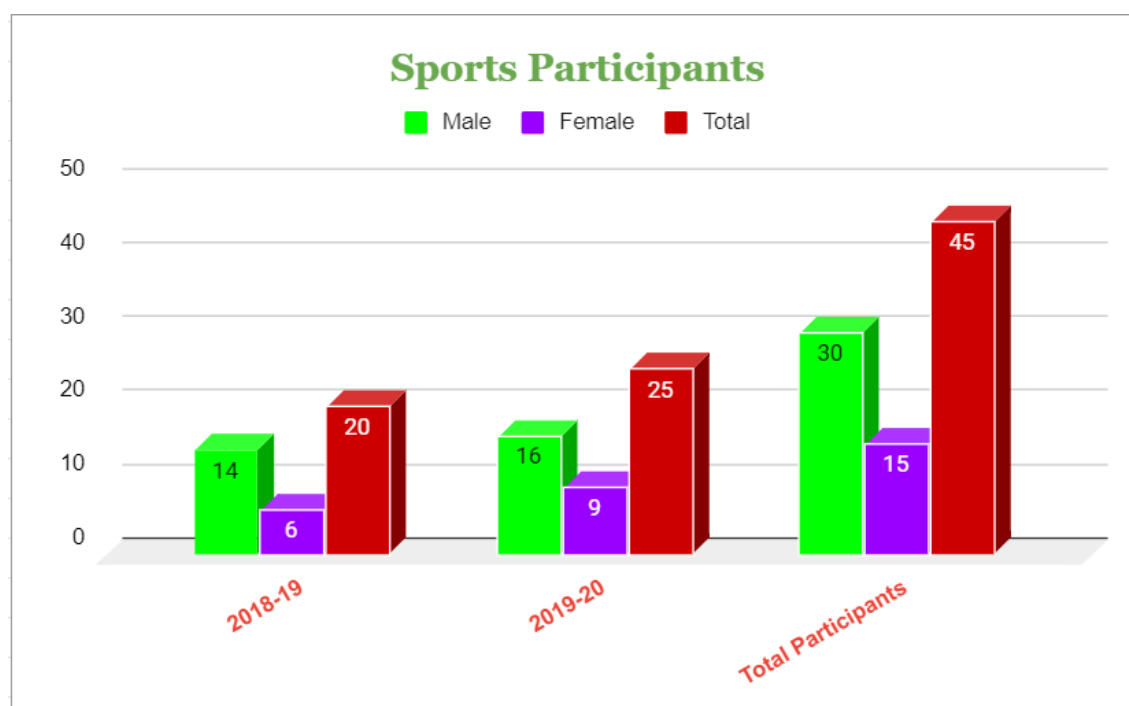


Figure No. 11. : Graphical representation of No. of students participated in various sport activities during the last two years is given in Figure no. 12.

## **6. COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE:**

### **6.1 Classroom, Main building, library, Staffroom and Practical Lab:**

College provides spacious infrastructural facilities which include well equipped Classrooms and Practical Labs for all students, well facilitated Staffroom for teaching staff, Provision of ICT- based study material (e-books, e-journals, etc.) to students in the library, Internet facility to faculty & students and Seminar halls with ICT facilities

### **6.2 Ladies rooms & washrooms:**

Provision of ladies room is made for rest mode of girls which includes beds with one attached washroom. It is suggested that proper cleaning and hygienic conditions to be maintained.

### **6.3 Vending Machine:**

Vending machine for Sanitary napkins and sanitary napkins disposal machine are provided which is placed in appropriate place with Instruction display in the college for proper utilization.

### **6.4 Complaint box mechanism:**

A suggestion box is provided for students, which is opened on regular intervals and corrective actions are taken on the same.

### **6.5 Drinking water:**

Water purifiers are placed at different places for the convenience of students..

### **6.6 CCTV:**

CCTV cameras are installed at possible areas for full coverage of security of girls.

### **6.7 Ladies Staffroom & Toilet:**

College has separate Ladies Staffroom Facility and toilet facilities

### **6.8 Notification of Helpline number:**

Helpline number is displayed on sexual harassment display board.

## 6.9 Facilities For Girls In Institution Campus

- As the Campus is full of students, to avoid rush & other mishaps, separate provisions for girls are made at various places in the college campus.
- Separate study facility is made available for girls students with adequate space
- **Ladies Room:** Provision is made for girls resting mode in ladies room. Napkin vending machine is also made available for girls during their menses
- **Girls Washroom:** Washrooms are situated with ample supply of water and regular cleaning. A separate washroom is available for female staff.
- Recreational facilities, gymnasium, yoga center, two daily newspapers and magazine are provided to the girls' hostel. The sports facility for the indoor games like chess and caromis also available. Gymnasium is in the college campus.

## 6.10 Sports for Girls

- Sports department organizes volley ball, cricket tournaments, weight lifting competitions at zonal and inter-zonal level in collaboration with the University authorities and local sports clubs.
- Sports facility for the indoor games like chess and carom is also available.
- Gymnasium is in the college campus which helps students to train themselves.
- Professional training is also made available to the students by the college whenever necessary. As a result of this efforts the students are able to train and participate in sports and games at all levels; from University to the international level.

## **7. STATUTORY COMMITTEES FOR PROTECTION OF WOMEN AGAINST MISCONDUCT AND WELFARE**

### **7.1 Anti-Ragging Committee**

- The mandatory Anti-Ragging Committee is functioning in the college to resolve related problems.
- Permanent notice boards mentioning the names of the members of the Committee alongwith contact numbers are displayed on the prominent places.
- At the time of admission, an undertaking regarding anti-ragging is taken from every student with the signature of one of parent.
- Faculty members along with the discipline committee keep close watch on students behavior.
- During two years of assessment, zero ragging cases on the campus were observed.

### **7.2 Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee (PSH)**

- The mandatory Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee (PSH) is functioning in the college to resolve problems pertaining to sexual harassment
- Through this committee the female students are made aware of issues regarding gender rights in case of complaints against abusive behavior.
- Permanent notice boards indicating names of the members of the Committee along with contact numbers of the Principal and of the two nearest police stations are displayed in prominent places on the campus. This instills confidence in girl students about their safety.
- Every year the role and objectives of the committee and laws pertaining to the subject are brought to the notice of all students through notification.
- Complaints from girl students are received and registered by the PSH committee and proper resolution and follow-up is done. Generally the problems are solved through dialogue and counseling.
- Gender sensitization programmed and self-defense training programmes are organized every year.

### **7.3 Students' Grievance Redressal Cell**

- The **Students' Grievance Redressal Cell** is functioning in the college to resolve students' complaints and grievances.
- Majority of grievances are resolved amicably at the cell or departmental level .
- One of the members of the Cell is a student representative.
- Suggestion boxes are kept in different places on the campus. They are opened regularly by members of the committee and grievances (if any) are redressed through the committee.

#### **7.4. Counselling Cell**

- For students, college has established a cell for counseling and career guidance in the separate room.
- For career guidance, cell has maintains own library which provides books related to competitive examinations.
- Students' Counseling Cell also take initiative for solving students psychological problems for which one of the member of this committee is a professional psychologist.
- The cell tries to rehabilitate students suffering from psychic problems like study habits, social behavior problem, phobia. phobia related to examination, anxiety and depression, lack of confidence, time Management for study purposes, concentration problem, etc.
- Major problem of drop out of girls from college due to marriage are tackled by the cell byconvincing them and their parents to continue their education even after marriage throughdistance mode.
- Complaints from girl students are received and registered by the PSH committee and proper resolution and follow-up is done. Generally, the problems are solved throughdialogue and counseling.

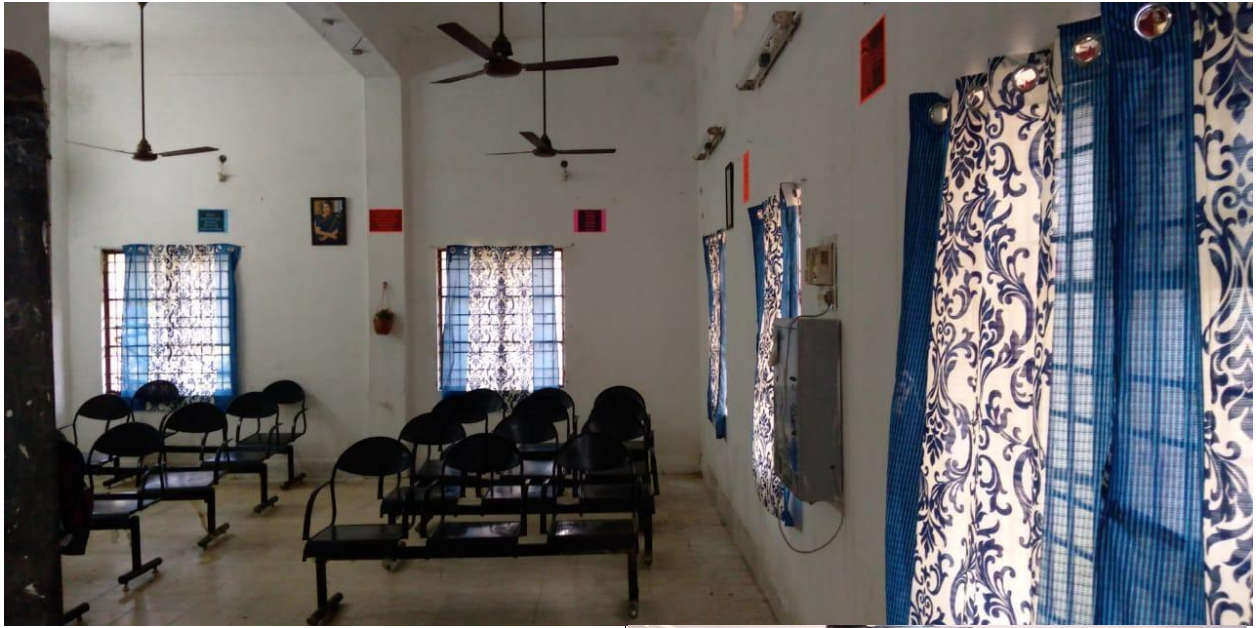

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## 1. INTRODUCTION

### **About College:**

The Pithapuram estate was ruled by illustrious sons of Rao family, beginning from Sri Rao Rayanam Garu in 1602. In the succession, later on, Neeladri Rayanam Garu was recognized by Moghul Vice Roy as Rajah of Pithapuram.

His eldest grandson Sri Rao Venkata Mahipathi Gangadhara Rama Rao became the Rajah in 1861. He was good administrator and legendary philanthropist. Today's P.R. Government College was first started by him as a High School in August 1884.

In appreciation of his services the prince of Wales conferred on him the richly deserved title "Maharajah" in 1887. Later he was nominated as a member of the then Madras Legislative Council in 1877. He was blessed with a son on 5th October 1885 who was named as Surya Rao Bahadur. The child lost his mother on the third day after his birth. Sri Gangadhara Rama Rao also died in 1890 when the child was five years old.

Smt. Rani Bhavayamma Rao of Chitrada groomed the boy. At the age of nine he was sent to Madras where he had his High School education in Newingdon School. He passed his Matriculation Examination from Madras University at the age of seventeen.

After winning a legal battle he ascended the throne and became the Maharajah of Pithapuram on 19-02-1907. He married Rani Chinnamamba Devi, Daughter of Sri Rajah Venkata Rangaiah Appa Rao of Nuzvid Estate.

Sri Mokkaapati Subbarayudu was his tutor in Madras High School, who moulded the Rajah into a fine gentleman with noble qualities.

Sri Subbarayudu was a genius and a scholar in English, Telugu & Sanskrit. He was a great visionary. He was brought as a dewan of Pithapuram Estate. He had done Yeoman service to develop the estate.

Sri Surya Rao Bahadur himself was a scholar in English, Telugu and Sanskrit languages. He was a lover and patron of men of letter and artists.

Pithapuram estate flourished well during the reign of the Maharajah.

More than any one, it was Brahmaharshi Venkata Ratnam Naidu garu, the revered guru of the Maharajah, who guided him in matters of religion, education and social reform. He also

encouraged him in works of charity and welfare of the people.

The Pithapuram Durbar was an abode for all men of letter, writers, pundits and musicians. It was really a golden age for Pithapuram. Like Sri Krishna Deva Raya, the Maharajah encouraged many poets and writers in his court. Veritably the Court was a nest of nightingales. Pundits like Sripada Lakshmi Narayana Sastry, Tata Subbaraya Sastry, the famous musician Sri T. Sangameswara Sastry adorned the court of the Maharajah. Sri Panugantivaruru and Devulapalli Brothers, and Venkata Parvatisa Kavulu were the "Court Poets". Similarly, a number of famous Telugu writers like Chilakamarthi and Veeresalingam Pantulu were welcomed and honoured.

The Maharajah's service to Telugu literature was commendable. The Telugu Academy was started under the guidance of Late Sri Jayanti Ramayya Pantulu Garu. He took keen interest in publishing old manuscripts. With enormous financial assistance he brought out an Encyclopedia in Telugu, which was named after him, the Surya Raya Nighantuvu' A number of eminent scholars like late Sri Kasibhotla Subbaraya Sastry and late Sri Divakarla Venkatavadhani were employed for the work. In recognition of his service to Telugu Literature, the Andhra University conferred on him D.Litt. and Kalaprapoorna.

It was in the Maharajah's Court that the great Veena exponent late Sri T. Sangameswara Sastry spent his whole life as estate musician. (1873-1932) There were a number of episodes about his expert rendition on the Veena. Tagore once visited Pithapuram and Rajah donated one lakh of rupees for Santhinikethan.

Kakinada, was the gift of the late Maharajah of Pithapuram, Sri Rao Venkata Mahipathi Suryarao Bahadur. Its cosmopolitan culture, its religious tolerance was due to the influence of Brahmanism - a sort of refined Hinduism - practiced and propagated by the Maharajah under the benign influence of his great guru late Sri Raghupati Venkata Ratnam Naidu.

Brahmarshi Sri R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu Garu, was a servant, a scholar of eminence and a staunch Brahma leader. With his imposing personality and dignified figure, with his religious fervor and zeal for social reform, he exercised a wholesome influence on the intellectuals of Kakinada. He was the Principal of P.R. College for 17 years. Kakinada was a seat of Brahmanism for three decades. The Brahmasamajam Brahma Mandir opposite to the Science College was the citadel of Brahmanism. Here marriages were solemnized under the guidance of Sir R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu, Dr. Vemuri Ramakrishna Rao and Sri Peddada Rama

Swamy, Eminent scholars used to deliver lectures in this Mandir. Till recently it housed the library of Sir R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu.

The Maharajah spent huge amounts of money on education. He raised the P.R. College to the First Grade status in 1926, when the Andhra University was started in the same year. P.R. College is the pride of Kakinada, the first of its kind in this area. Here girls were given education free. The Science College, the High School and the attached Hostels were the gift of the Maharajah. When the strength grew in numbers, the Arts college was shifted to the present building situated in the heart of the town. It has an area of 36 acres full of green lawns and mango trees.

The place now occupied by the Super Bazar, the L.I.C. building and Venkataratnapuram are the gifts of the Maharajah. The Building where Sir R. Venkata Ratnam Naidu lived and passed away was given to the Harijan Hostel in Venkata Ratnapuram.

The Maharajah's heart was tender and full of the milk of human kindness. His compassion for the poor and the depressed classes and his concern for the Harijan Girls resulted in the birth of an orphanage. The beautiful and spacious building which is now Rangaraya Medical College was the orphanage run by the Maharajah of Pithapuram. Here Harijan Girls were fed, clothed and given free education. The Maharajah took up the Harijan problem even before Gandhiji thought about it. So too in Pithapuram there used to be a similar facility for Harijan Boys and Girls.

The Shastipurti celebrations of the Maharajah were held for five continuous days at Pithapuram. It was a splendid spectacle for all, a feast to the eye and the ear. poets and musicians, pundits and philosophers, artists and actors, the poor and the needy received invaluable gifts on the occasion. He personally distributed silver bowls containing gold coins to all the scholars and pundits. It was a land mark in the life of the Maharajah.

In 1948 with the abolition of the 'Zamindari System' the Maharajah handed over the management of the College with its assets and buildings to the Government of Madras. The century old institution, trained thousands of students and provided opportunities to many students to serve and work in the institution. Many eminent administrators, scientists and artists were the products of this great institution. The College was the heart of Sri R. Venkataratnam Naidu Garu and the orphanage was the darling child of the Maharajah. The

Maharajah passed away in 1964 With him the glory of the estate also waned and an era ended. He was a fine gentleman, cultured, dignified and charitable. His charity knew no bounds. The spirit of the Maharajah Broods over the college. But his college, a temple of Learning stands there forever spreading sweetness and light, a monument to the munificence of the Maharajah. We shall remember him with profound gratitude

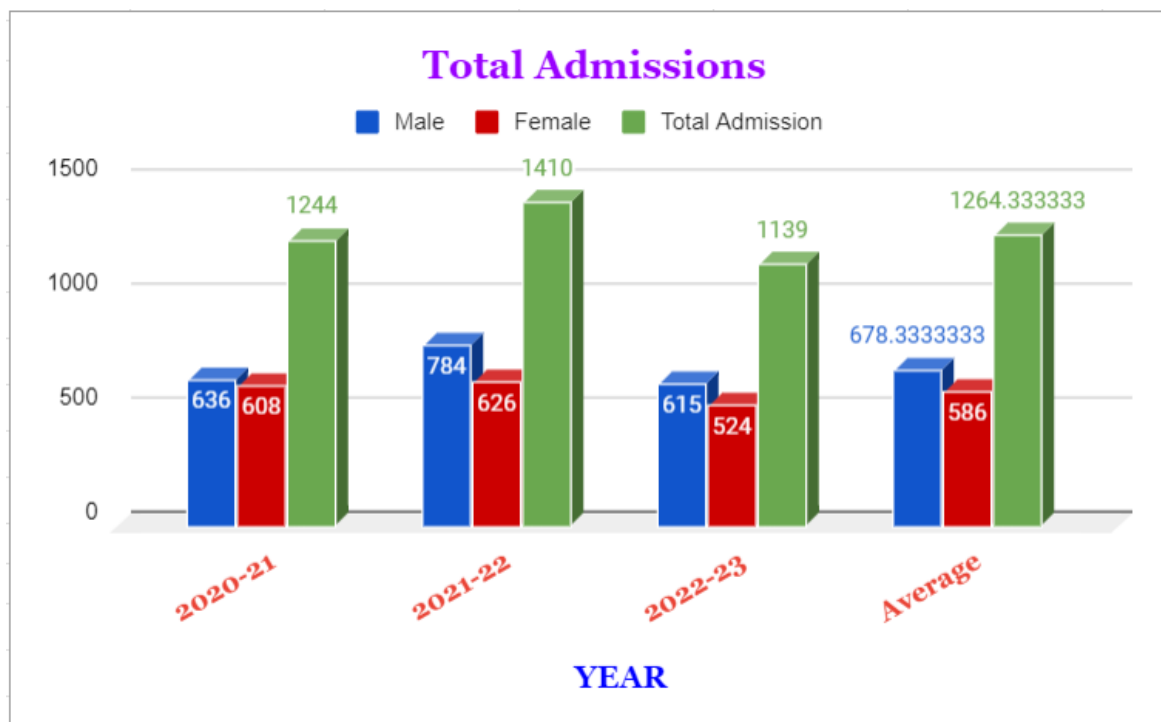

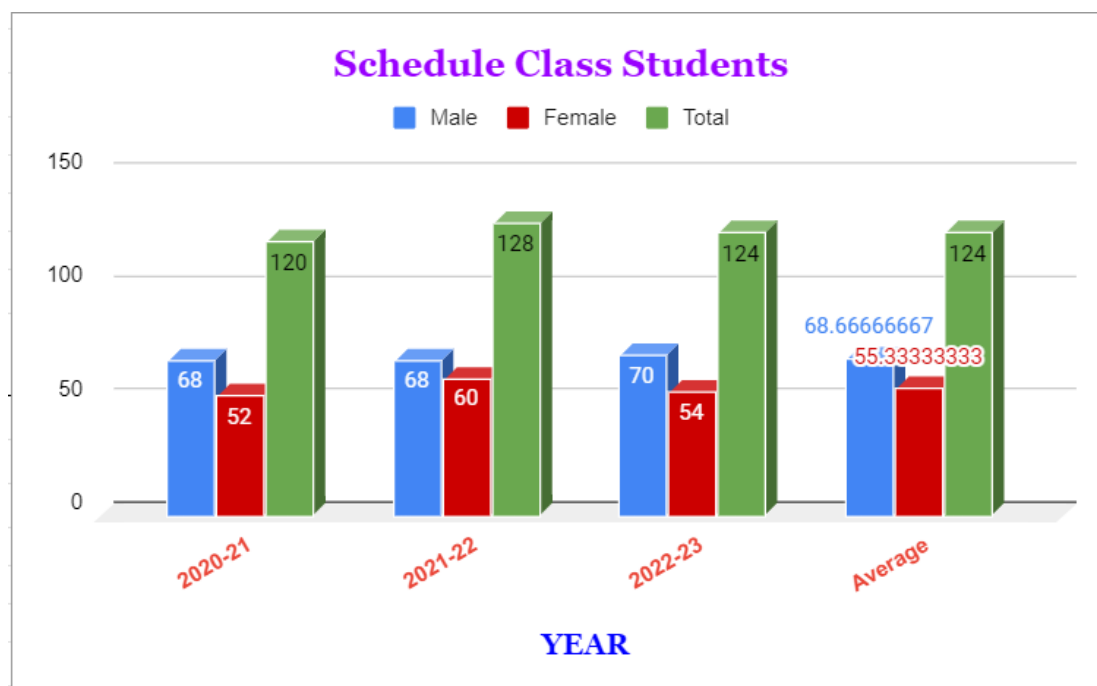

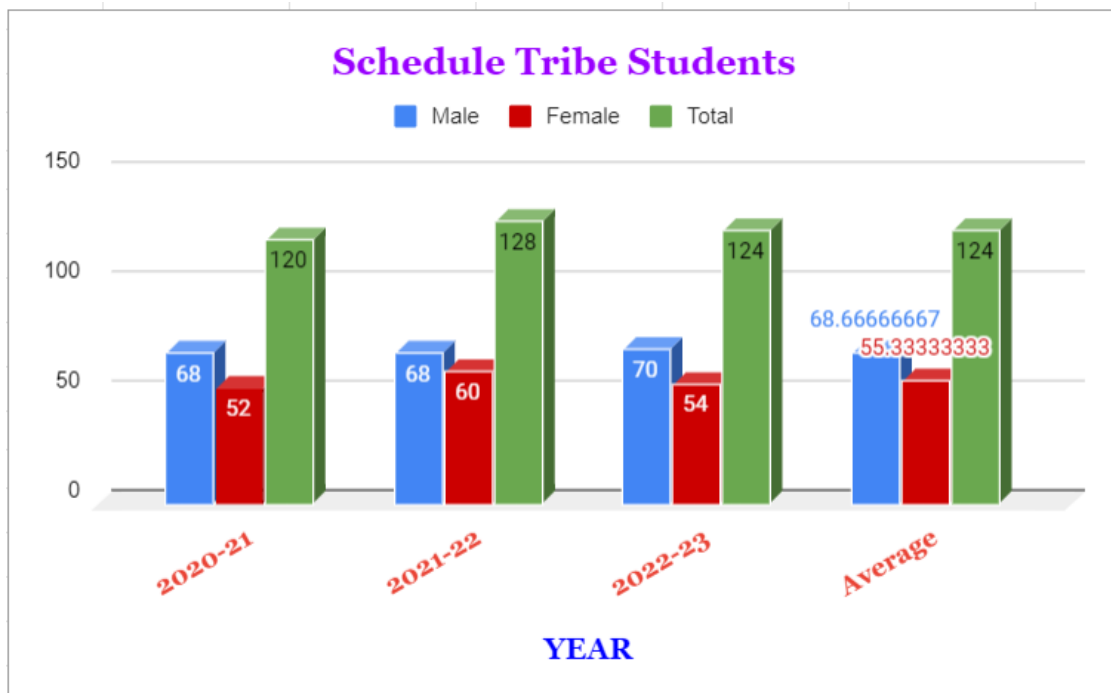
**Figure No. 2: Graphical representation of SC category students admissions during the three years**

**Figure No. 3:** Graphical representation of ST category students admissions

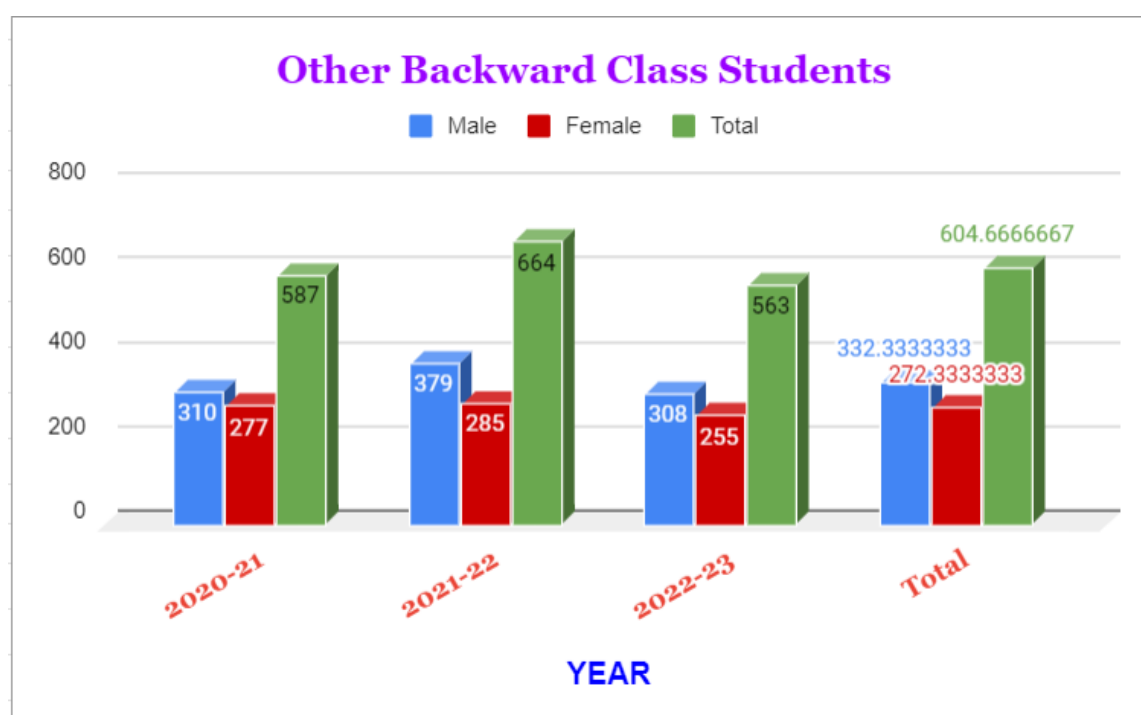

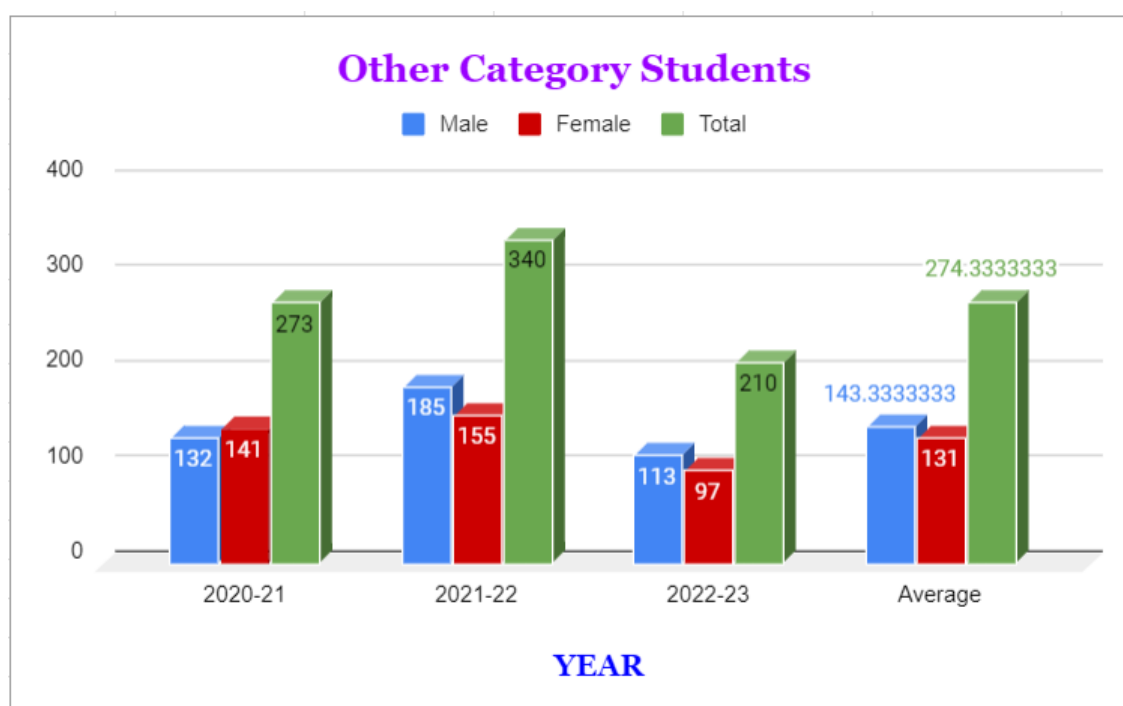
**Figure No. 4:** Graphical representation of OBC category students admissions

**Figure No. 5:** Graphical representation of General category students admissions

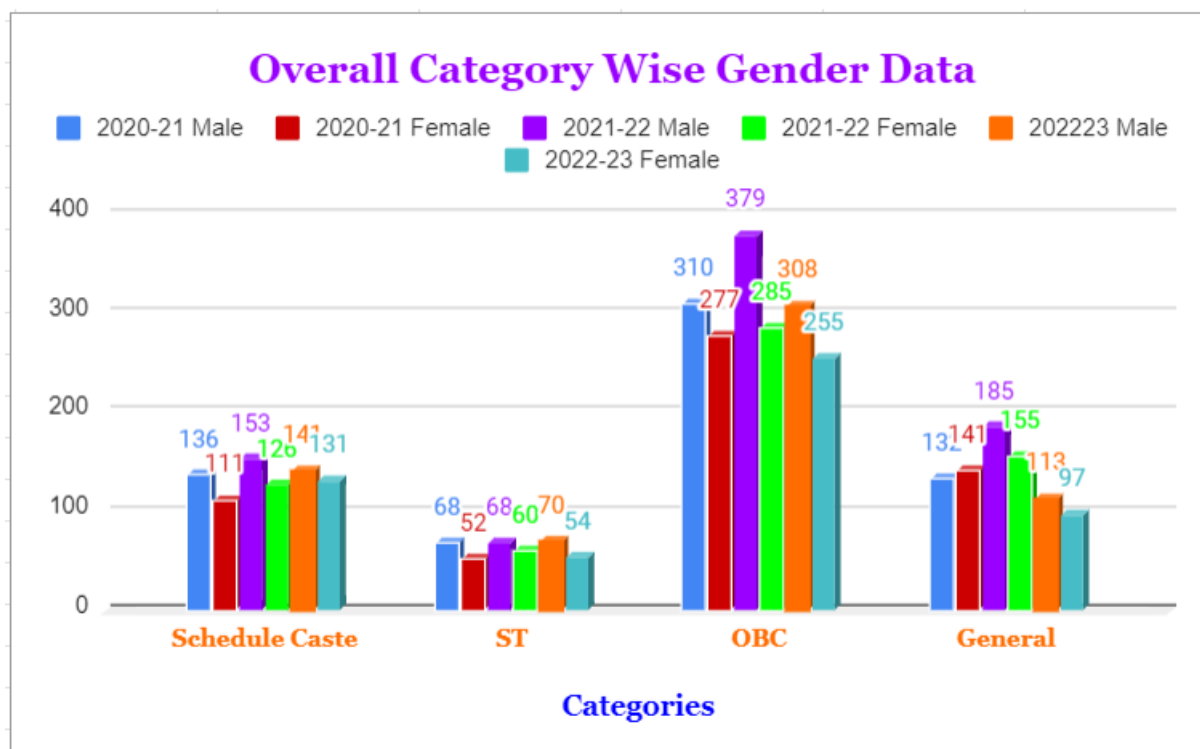

**Figure No. 6:** Graphical representation of overall category wise students admissions for three years

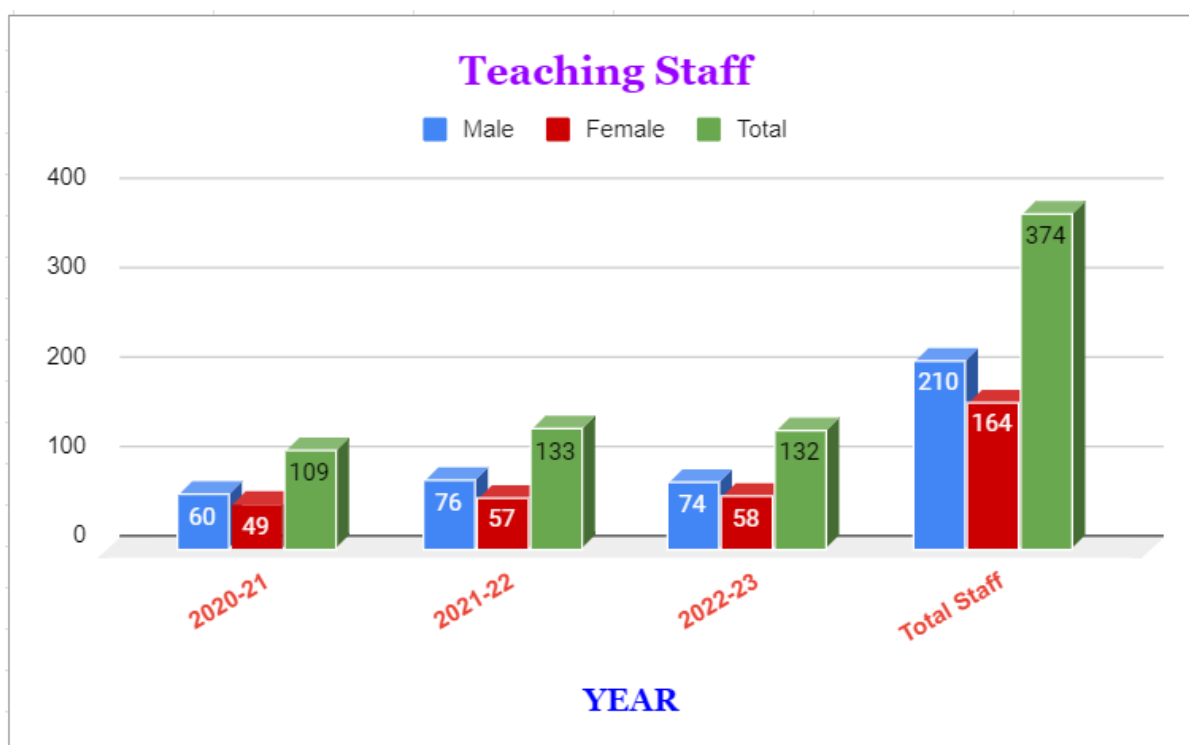

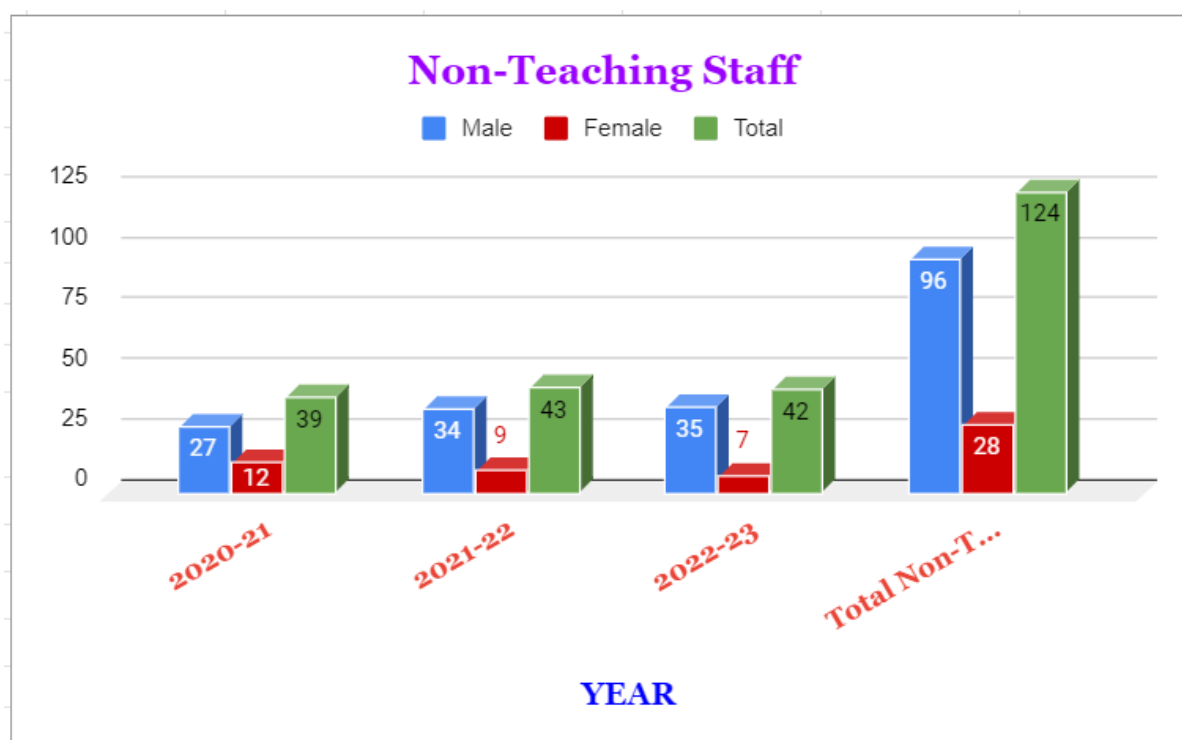
**Figure No. 7: Graphical representation of Teaching Staff Male/Female Classification for three years is given in Figure no. 7.**

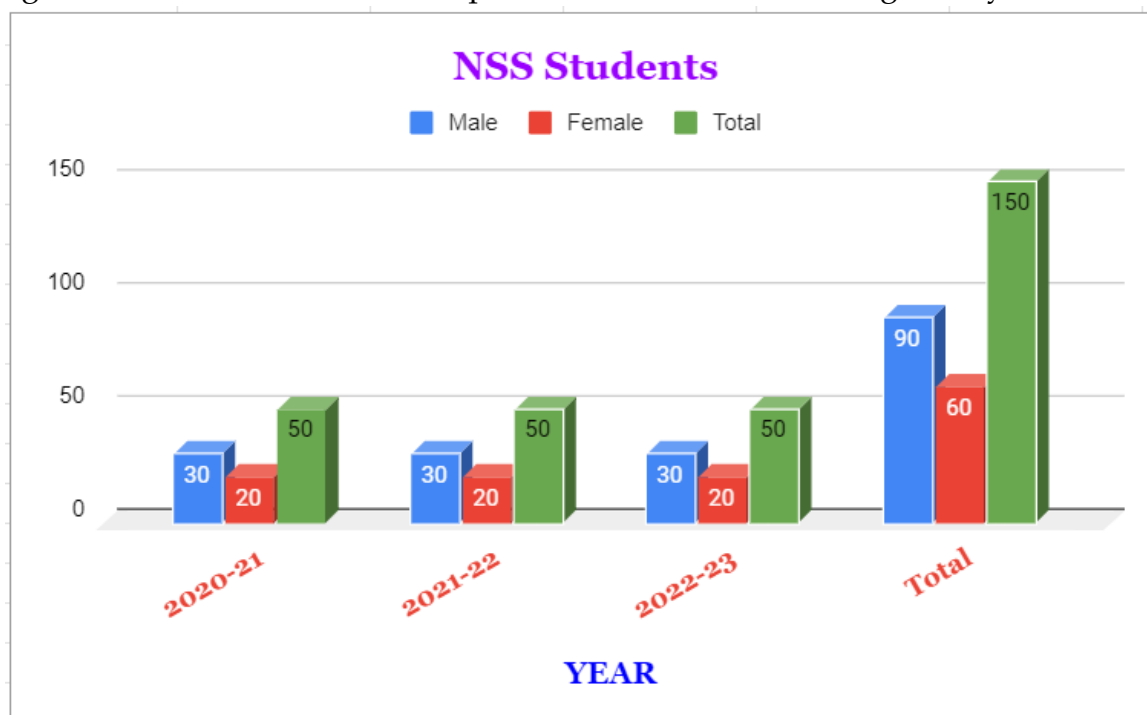


Figure No. 9. The graphical representation of No. of students enrolled in NSS for three years is given in Figure no. 9.

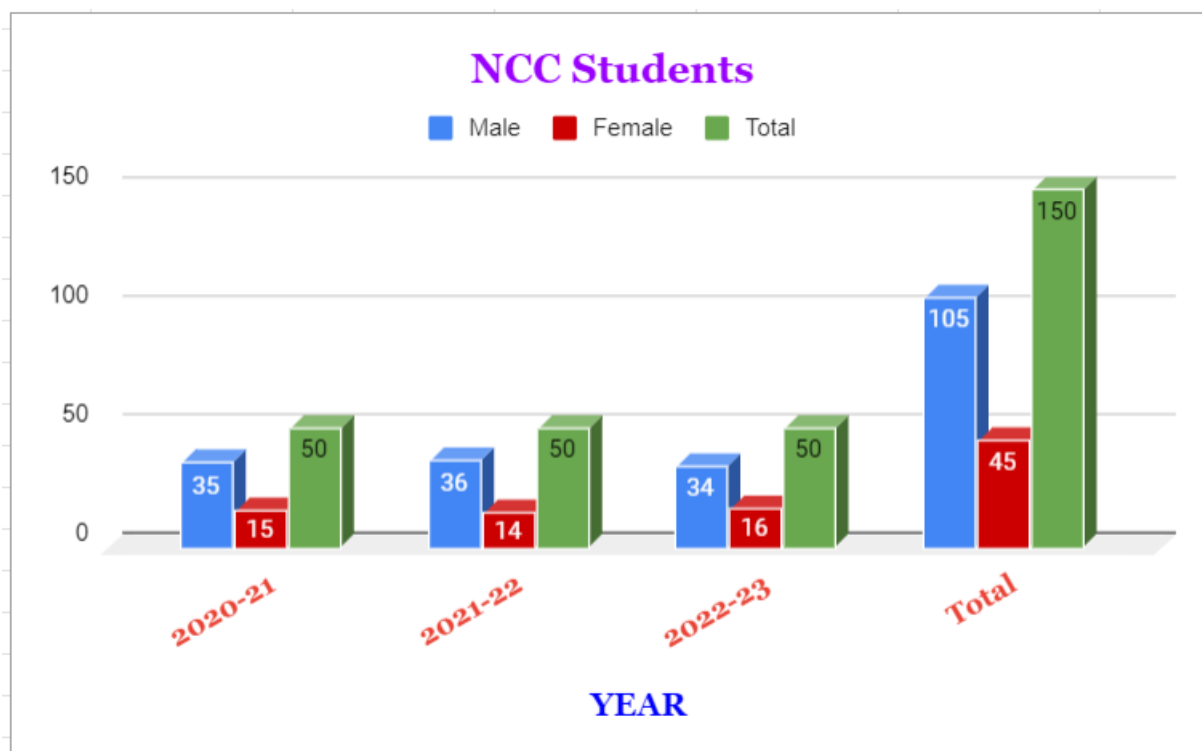


Figure No. 10. Graphical representation of No. of students enrolled in NCC during the last three years is given in Figure no. 10.

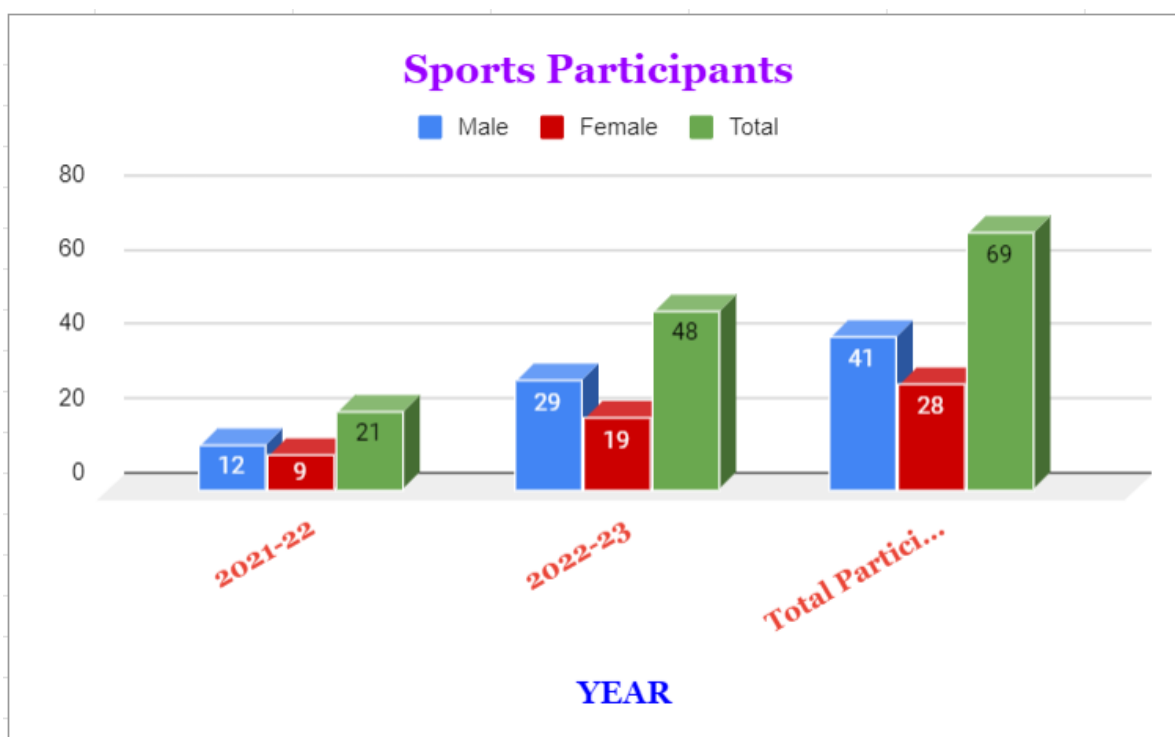


Figure No. 11 : Graphical representation of No. of students participated in various sport activities during the last five years is given in Figure no. 11.

## **6. COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE:**

### **6.7 Ladies Staffroom & Toilet:**

College has separate Ladies Staffroom Facility and toilet facilities

### **6.8 Notification of Helpline number:**

Helpline number is displayed on sexual harassment display board.

## 6.9 Facilities For Girls In Institution Campus

- As the Campus is full of students, to avoid rush & other mishaps, separate provisions for girls are made at various places in the college campus.
- Separate study facility is made available for girls students with adequate space
- **Ladies Room:** Provision is made for girls resting mode in ladies room. Napkin vending machine is also made available for girls during their menses
- **Girls Washroom:** Washrooms are situated with ample supply of water and regular cleaning. A separate washroom is available for female staff.
- Recreational facilities, gymnasium, yoga center, two daily newspapers and magazine are provided to the girls' hostel. The sports facility for the indoor games like chess and caromis also available. Gymnasium is in the college campus.

## 6.10 Sports for Girls

- Sports department organizes volley ball, cricket tournaments, weight lifting competitions at zonal and inter-zonal level in collaboration with the University authorities and local sports clubs.
- Sports facility for the indoor games like chess and carom is also available.
- Gymnasium is in the college campus which helps students to train themselves.
- Professional training is also made available to the students by the college whenever necessary. As a result of this efforts the students are able to train and participate in sports and games at all levels; from University to the international level.

## **7. STATUTORY COMMITTEES FOR PROTECTION OF WOMEN AGAINST MISCONDUCT AND WELFARE**

### **7.1 Anti-Ragging Committee**

- The mandatory Anti-Ragging Committee is functioning in the college to resolve related problems.
- Permanent notice boards mentioning the names of the members of the Committee alongwith contact numbers are displayed on the prominent places.
- At the time of admission, an undertaking regarding anti-ragging is taken from every student with the signature of one of parent.
- Faculty members along with the discipline committee keep close watch on students behavior.
- During two years of assessment, zero ragging cases on the campus were observed.

### **7.2 Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee (PSH)**

- The mandatory Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee (PSH) is functioning in the college to resolve problems pertaining to sexual harassment
- Through this committee the female students are made aware of issues regarding gender rights in case of complaints against abusive behavior.
- Permanent notice boards indicating names of the members of the Committee along with contact numbers of the Principal and of the two nearest police stations are displayed in prominent places on the campus. This instills confidence in girl students about their safety.
- Every year the role and objectives of the committee and laws pertaining to the subject are brought to the notice of all students through notification.
- Complaints from girl students are received and registered by the PSH committee and proper resolution and follow-up is done. Generally the problems are solved through dialogue and counseling.
- Gender sensitization programmed and self-defense training programmes are organized every year.

### **7.3 Students' Grievance Redressal Cell**

- The **Students' Grievance Redressal Cell** is functioning in the college to resolve students' complaints and grievances.
- Majority of grievances are resolved amicably at the cell or departmental level .
- One of the members of the Cell is a student representative.
- Suggestion boxes are kept in different places on the campus. They are opened regularly by members of the committee and grievances (if any) are redressed through the committee.

#### **7.4. Counselling Cell**

- For students, college has established a cell for counseling and career guidance in the separate room.
- For career guidance, cell has maintains own library which provides books related to competitive examinations.
- Students' Counseling Cell also take initiative for solving students psychological problems for which one of the member of this committee is a professional psychologist.
- The cell tries to rehabilitate students suffering from psychic problems like study habits, social behavior problem, phobia. phobia related to examination, anxiety and depression, lack of confidence, time Management for study purposes, concentration problem, etc.
- Major problem of drop out of girls from college due to marriage are tackled by the cell byconvincing them and their parents to continue their education even after marriage throughdistance mode.
- Complaints from girl students are received and registered by the PSH committee and proper resolution and follow-up is done. Generally, the problems are solved throughdialogue and counseling.

### 8. Women Empowerment Cell (WEC)

For the Social, Educational, Economic, Political and Psychological empowerment of women establishment of Women Empowerment Cell (WEC) has gone a long way in the development of sense of women empowerment. Under this committee they have arranged various programmes for the orientation of ladies regarding health and medical, social awareness and honing of cultural, social, and artistic activities suitable to overall development.


# Student Interaction Program

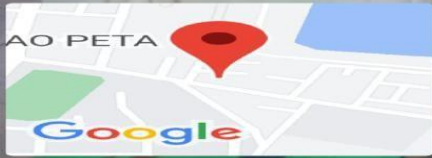
### Yoga & Meditation Classes

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### 3. CONCLUSION

- i. This college is one of the oldest colleges in India with 139 golden years of service to the nation. Right from its inception, this college is known for promoting women's education in the state of Andhra Pradesh.
- ii. This college has no bias based on gender. The College is open to educating even the 'Third gender'  
The rule of reservation 33% quota for women in admissions was followed strictly even during offline admissions during the academic years 2018-2023. With the advent of online admissions from the AY 2020-21, centralized admission process is being implemented by APSICHE AP State Council of Higher Education duly following all the rules of reservation for women.
- iii. The College gives equal importance to all the Genders. It shows no discrimination based on gender, right from admissions to the conduct of activities in the college.
- iv. In the current AY 2022-23 the college has 46.01% girls and 53.99 % boys and 0 % third gender among the students. Every class has a girl representative and a boy representative to monitor the class activities. In the Current AY 2022-23 among the teaching staff 43.94 % are women, 56.06 % men and 0 % third gender Women staff are given due representation in all the statutory and non-statutory committees of the college.
- v. The College has a Women Empowerment Cell which conducts many activities on Women Empowerment and Gender Sensitization. Programmes are conducted by Women Empowerment Cell for the boys as well to educate them on gender equity.
- vi. During the five years (2018-19 & 2022-23) of assessment it is observed that the college has organized various gender equity programmes which help reduce gender inequality in the campus.
- vii. Women Empowerment Cell has conducted activities related to promoting gender equity even in the adopted village of the college Ganganapalli, which is 4Km away from the College locality
- viii. There are Antisexual harassment & Anti ragging committees which receives the grievances related to sexual harassment & ragging. It is pertinent to note that in the last five years no complaint on sexual harassment has been lodged, which indicates the friendly atmosphere between the boys and girls on the campus.
- ix. Equal Opportunities Centre (EOC) also conducts activities for the women belonging to reserved categories.

- x. No cases of sexual harassment were reported even by any of the faculty members in the last five years.

**Suggestions:**

College has taken due precaution for giving equal opportunities male and female representation in all the curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of college. However, the following suggestions are made for further improvements.

1. Considering 46.01% of female students and 43.85% of female teaching staff & 22.79% of female non-Teaching staff it is suggested to increase female teaching in the college to maintain gender balance.
